

Official Jamboree Uniform -- Official Scout Clothing Only - NO SUBSTITUTES!

Only Official Scout-related clothing or Scout suitable clothing will be allowed in the bus and in the campsite!

No school logo clothing, no clothing with political statements or anything controversial, no commercial logos, etc. If you have to ask if it's appropriate, then it's probably not. The National Jamboree is a Troop and Varsity Scout level event. **Explorer or Venturing uniforming is not allowed.**

You **must** be wearing an official Field or Activities uniform (Class "A" or Class "B") every time you leave your campsite.

Field Uniform (Class A) – Can be worn at any time. MUST be worn during travel, sightseeing, arena shows, dinner meals, and other formal occasions. The standard BSA or Centennial uniform may be worn – your Scoutmaster will have more details at jamboree troop meetings.

- Tan Field Uniform (Class A) shirt (2 or 3) with:
 - Jamboree patch (2 provided)
 - Jamboree JSP (3 provided)
 - Troop numeral (3 provided)
 - U.S. Flag
 - World Crest
 - Rank patch
 - Patrol patch
 - Any earned knots
 - Arrow of Light (if applicable)
 - Interpreter Strip (if applicable)
 - Position patch
 - Trained patch
 - Nameplate (provided)
 - Red epaulets
 - Temporary patch
- **No Quality Unit patch**
- Jamboree neckerchief (One will be provided. The Troop will designate its own official neckwear for use prior to the Jamboree)
- Neckerchief slide of choice
- Standard BSA visored cap
- Jamboree ball cap (optional for class B)
- Scout shorts (any official BSA shorts) (2-3 recommended)
- Scout khaki web or leather belt
- Scout socks (any official red top)
- Proper & *comfortable* closed-toe shoes
- Red BSA jacket or tan jamboree jacket
- Red or tan BSA rain gear or any outdoor store rain gear that has NO logo, artwork or school or commercial emblems on it.

Activities Uniform (Class B) – Can be worn during the informal events during jamboree, which is most of the time. **Each participant will receive a troop t- shirt as part of fees).**

- Jamboree Activities T shirt
- Any home-troop, BSA camp or other BSA promotional event shirt
- Jamboree ball cap or bucket hat
- Scout shorts only!
- Scout socks only!
- Scout belt
- Proper & *comfortable* closed-toe shoes (Make sure they are broken in prior to Jamboree)

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fanny pack or other means to carry water bottles, camera, sunscreen, map, poncho, patches, small flashlight, Personal First Aid stuff, etc during the day at Jamboree (Daypack still required) • 1 Bible, or prayer book - according to faith • notebook, pen, pencil • camera (single-use is good), film • book, cards, etc. for travel • drinking cup, collapsible • shaving gear (if needed) • shoelaces, extra pair • ditty bags for small items • pillow (small) • patches for trading • personal friendship gifts • money, traveler's checks (with Scout's name on them), VISA BUXX, etc. (about \$20-25 per day is a good amount - bring quarters for machines) • telephone numbers and e-mail addresses of those at home • pre-addressed, stamped envelopes & postcards • handkerchiefs (3) • plastic trash bags to cover uniform & other gear to keep clean and <i>dry</i> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • business cards to exchange with other Scouts • clothes pins • clothes line (50') • plastic coat hangers for uniform • long sleeve shirt • camp stool or collapsible chair for in camp (<i>must fit in duffel bag</i>) • calling card, pre-paid phone card, or 1-800 information – cell phones not recommended • <i>Boy Scout Handbook</i> • <i>Fieldbook</i> • No boom-boxes are allowed. NO PERSONAL ELECTRONICS DEVICES, GAMES, PDA's etc ARE ALLOWED (other than a small FM only personal radio with ear plugs)! • battery operated lantern (spare battery and bulb) • <i>Scout Songbook</i> • duffel bag lock • coin purse or wallet • sunglasses • musical instrument • 1 plastic wash basin • laundry materials (detergent in small plastic bottle) • 1 sewing kit |
